LIVERSEDGE HANDBELLS

The "Liversedge Handbells" are a 4 ½ octave set of restored Mears & Stainbank (Whitechapel) bells donated to the region by Mrs Elizabeth Lee. Following an appeal for donations toward the cost of restoration the work was undertaken by the Whitechapel Bell Foundry in 2010 / 2011.

The North East Region Committee make the bells available on loan to groups wanting to start ringing, whilst waiting to purchase or restore their own set; The most recent recipients being the newly formed Hedon Handbell Ringers.

The handbells are currently stored in Beverley awaiting requests from groups wanting to use them. As some of you are already aware, the registration for the International Symposium in Vancouver in 2016 is now open.

The Symposium website is http://www.ihs2016vancouver.ca/

The cost for the Symposium is \$1150 Canadian dollars. If you register and pay a deposit before 31st October 2015, the cost is \$1085. Do note that if you register after 26th February, 2016, the cost will be \$1250.

Unlike in previous years, you will register yourself and everything will be done via the Symposium website. However in order to register, you require a code from me. This is because every guild is given an initial set allocation of places.

To obtain this code, I require from you the name of the team you will be ringing with, the team conductor or contact person and also your region. I have attached the full registration instructions to this email – but they are available on the website – as too is a list of IHS2016 special rate hotels.

Should you not have a team or if there are only a couple of you, please let me know. We will form you into Team HRGB. I will let you know who makes up this team so that you can make arrangements with each other for hotels, travel or music practice before hand.

Please do let others in your region know that the Symposium registration is now open and ask them to get in touch with me should they be interested in attending and taking advantage of the early bird registration fee.

If there are other questions at the moment, I will try and answer them.

HISTORY

The UN International Day of Peace, generally known as World Peace Day or Peace Day, is observed annually on 21 September. It is dedicated to world peace, and specifically the absence of war and violence — this day is observed with a temporary ceasefire in a combat zone to enable humanitarian aid access. It was established by a United Nations resolution in 1981 to coincide with the opening of the General Assembly's yearly session. The UN International Day of Peace was first celebrated in 1982, and is honoured by many nations and peoples. In 2001, 21 September was designated as the official date for World Peace Day.
